5. ELIGIBILITY OF COMPETITORS

By invitation the SAES competition is open to all classes mentioned in article 1 above.

6. INJURY REGISTER

It is the competitor's responsibility to submit a medical certificate that they are fit to compete in motorsport no later than 5 working days before the start of the event, by sending it to MSA Head Office for review and processing. It is the competitor's responsibility to check the Injury Register and ensure that MSA receives their letter timeously. Refer MSA Appendix L – Article 2.9 Please Note: Competing while appearing on the injury register will result in potential claims being repudiated by the MSA Group Accident Policy. Refer to Appendix L – Article 2.9

7. COMPETITOR CONDUCT

- 1. Judges of Fact / Observers may be appointed in terms of GCR 161, and their names will be listed either in the final instructions or by a driver's bulletin. They will report on cutting of corners, persistent off- circuit behaviour and poor driving / riding standards. Reported competitors who continue to disregard safe driving / riding conduct may be black flagged and may be excluded from the race.
- 2. Judges of Fact may also be appointed and listed to oversee starting procedures and report infringements.
- 3. Competitors are advised that should an incident occur during a practice session, which involves the clearing of the circuit, their practice session will forfeit the clearing time required.
- 4. Drivers / Riders and teams to note 2025 SAE SSR's 15 and 16 for fuel, oil and coolant spillage.
- 5. Any competition vehicle / motorcycle found using the access roads, pits or any area other than the circuit for testing or being driven in a manner which is considered by the Clerk of the Course to be dangerous, may be excluded from the event and/or fined, irrespective of who was driving the vehicle / motorcycle at the time. Notwithstanding the competitor's exclusion, he may be reported to the Stewards of the Meeting who may consider taking further action in terms of GCR 172. Should any competitor / mechanic / crew member be found to be driving in an unsafe manner on the property the competitor concerned may be fined or excluded.

8. ENVIRONMENTAL

9. COMPETITION LICENCES

All competitors that participate in the event, need to have purchased the relevant MSA Competition licence for the class that they will be competing in. Licences can be checked electronically prior to the event using MSA's platforms.

SAE & V8 Roadster competitors require the minimum of a 2025 MSA National circuit car licence.

Super Vee competitors require a Regional Circuit car licence

MRSSA competitors require a National Challenge/Club Circuit motorcycle licence dependant on which class they are assigned.

SAGT Trophy require a club circuit car licence.

Organisers reserve their right to cancel a category should less than fifteen (15) entries in total be received for a category or should less than seventy-five (75) entries in total be received for the event by the date and time of entries closing. - Scrutineering will take place in the Pre-Race and Post-Race Paddock, throughout the event and will be conducted by the relevant officials.

<u>27. PITS</u>

- 1. The Pit and Paddock Allocation will be notified in the Final Instructions, once the number of entries for each category is established. Each Class / Category will be responsible for the policing and control of their designated areas.
- 2. Kindly note that *NO* persons under the age of sixteen (16) will be permitted on the pit lane.
- 3. Smoking on the pit lane/apron is strictly prohibited.
- 4. Children of competitors are not excluded from any of the above (refer GCR's 113 (xiv) and 172 (x)).
- 5. Strict controls with regards to restricted areas will be in place.
- 6. Due to Space constraints, the organisers have allocated the Main pit building to SAE Endurance class. All other nonendurance classes will pit on the Top "Platform" and will access and exit the circuit from there. Non-Endurance cars are not permitted in the Main pit building whatsoever.
- 7. Extremely strict fuel storage and refuel protocols will be enforced by the organisers of the event in line with contractual obligations with the circuit management.

PIT LANE	The pit lane speed is restricted to 50km/h	
PADDOCK / PIT ROADS	Speed must not exceed 40 km/h. No pit bikes, skateboards, scooters, or bicycles will be allowed in the paddock area. No loading and offloading may take place in Pits.	

PIT HYGIENE	The use of an environmental mat is compulsory! If you spill oil, please clean up after yourself. Use the oil bins provided that are marked with USED OIL.
SECURITY	Security guards will be provided but will not be held responsible for losses.

The meeting will not be postponed, abandoned, or cancelled without the consent of the MSA Steward in accordance with GCR 152 (vii).
